THE 'WREN' SOARS HIGH	TEARS AND LAUGHTER AS THE 'WREN' SOARS HIGH. Over 40 branches of Comhaltas throughout Ireland – and abroad! – resuscitated the 'wren' in 2022. On St. Stephen's Day, hundreds of musicians, singers and dancers took to the highways and byeways bringing joy and traditional entertainment to thousands of people in their homes, pubs, nursing homes and on the streets.
	As they travelled through the community, dressed in their colourful and varied outfits wearing an assortment of 'aghaidh fidils', they were welcomed with open doors and hearts. The older people wept with joy as they recounted their 'wren' experiences in days gone bye – shades of Jimín Mháire Thaidhg in our school days! Those in nursing homes had tales of nostalgia while those in pubs shared in the fun and there were many impromptu sessions.

CULTURAL CENTRES	Our 7 Regional Resource Centres and 11 outreach centres provide essential services of a varied nature to the organisation and community in their areas. These amenities cover the whole island of Ireland. They will play a significant role in the new ATHNUACHAN AR AN RÓD SEO ROMHAINN programme of Comhaltas.
MEITHEAL	This is an unique concept of Comhaltas which covers the whole island of Ireland. There are 7 Meitheal Teams mirroring the 7 Regional Resource Centres. It is project driven.
SEANAD 100	The centenary of Seanad Éireann was commemorated in the Dáil Chamber on the 12 th December 2022. All current and surviving former Senators were in attendance. The assembly was addressed by An Taoiseach Micheál Martin TD.
	Comhaltas was asked to provide a harpist and uilleann piper for the historic occasion, Mary Kelly and Eamonn Walsh were selected.
	The event was presided over by the Cathaoirleach Mark Daly who paid tribute to Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann on the contribution they had made to the cultural life of the nation over the last 70 years. He said that history was also made at the Seanad 100 on the 12 th December as it was the first time that music had been played at a session of the Oireachtas.

AWARDS	Tom Doorley has been selected as Ard-Ollamh for Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann 2023 in Mullingar. Tom is a much- acclaimed musician, music teacher and conductor/composer of the Comhaltas National Folk Orchestra of Ireland.
	Bardic Awards will be presented to Joe Connaire, Fleadh Cathaoirleach and music teacher; Pamella Schweblin, uilleann piper, Argentina; Dr. Daithí Kearney, musician and lecturer; Martin Gaffney, music teacher and graphic designer; Tommy Doherty, Scoil Éigse tutor; and harpist Gráinne Hambly.
THE DIASPORA	The Irish Diaspora will be feted at Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann next August. It will provide an opportunity to acknowledge and salute those of Irish extraction who have been to the fore in promoting Ireland's cultural identity globally.
