2023 has got off to a great start. Plans for Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann 2023 in Mullingar – following on from the cultural extravaganza that was Fleadh 2022 – are now at an advanced stage. The 500,000 Fleadh fans from last year will be pleased to learn that 2023 is promised to be even bigger and better. The dates are the  $6^{\rm th}$  –  $14^{\rm th}$  August.

We are also planning ahead. At a meeting of the Ardchomhairle on the  $11^{th}$  March, Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann 2024 was allocated to Wexford. The dates for your dairy are the  $4^{th}$  –  $12^{th}$  August, 2024.

### **FLEADH 2024**

After seven years campaigning to bring Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann to Wexford, their mission has been accomplished. There were jubilant scenes at Cultúrlann na hÉireann on the 11<sup>th</sup> March when the decision was announced by the Ardchomhairle. That singer supreme from Comhaltas Paddy Berry and the CEO of Wexford County Council Tom Enright – and their respective teams – said that an effective partnership is already in place to deliver a Fleadh worthy of the cultural movement, our supporters and our country.

#### **DIASPORA**

This year Diaspora will be the theme of Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann in Mullingar next August. Our emigrants are the people, who down through the years, brought our Irish cultural traditions to the countries of their adoption, promoted and enhanced those traditions which they introduced to our non-Irish friends. The group will link up with our branch in Brussels and also perform at the Irish Embassy.

### **JAPAN AND** ST. BRIGID

You may have seen online the wonderful pictures of our Comhaltas colleagues in Tokyo displaying the St. Brigid's Crosses which they made for the St. Brigid's festivities this year. Is it a case of 'being more Irish than the Irish themselves'? Our Tokyo Comhaltas branch is one of the foremost branches in the world. Do you remember when they sent two most impressive Céilí Bands to Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann in Ennis and got a historic prolonged standing ovation from the 2,000 strong audience.

#### **TTCT**

A reminder that the TTCT Diploma Course for teachers will be held at Cultúrlann na hÉireann on the 23<sup>rd</sup> - 29<sup>th</sup> July 2023. Over 850 teachers from Ireland and abroad have now qualified to date. There work and influence can be seen throughout the community. It is an intensive course with accomplished instructors and assessors.

**COMHDHÁIL 2023** The Annual Congress of Comhaltas will be held at Cultúrlann na hÉireann on the 6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> May. Delegates from Ireland and abroad will assemble to assess progress and plan for the future.

#### **ANNUAL REPORT**

The Annual Report of our cultural movement is now available. The 128 page document is an acknowledgment of the achievements delivered by a dedicated corps of volunteers.

As Uactarán na hÉireann Michael D. Higgins says in the Foreword:

'Volunteerism and generosity of spirit are the cornerstones of Comhaltas, and such values are manifest at the Fleadh. Its network of branches and events are underpinned by a corps of upwards on 50,000 volunteers. Each of these individuals plays a part in ensuring the vibrancy of the traditional living arts and sharing its appreciation with the upcoming generation of performers.'

### **PROSPECTUS**

A dedicated team have for the last number of months been working on a Comhaltas Prospectus which sets out the Comhaltas cultural journey since 1951 and provides a roadmap for the future up to 2030. It is now at an advanced stage and it is expected that it will be launched in April of this year.
