Through almost two years of uncertainty, Comhaltas guided its ship in turbulent waters. Safety, vision, tenacity, action and determination all blended together in a clarion call the response to which we can all be justly proud. ASHLING

All of us in Comhaltas and the world of Irish traditional music are shocked at the untimely death of Ashling Murphy. She was an exceptionally talented young lady who made an unforgettable impression on all who had the good fortune to know her.

Ashling was among the finest exponents of the concertina and fiddle and was also learning the uilleann pipes. She has featured in our Comhaltas Concert Tours and was also a valued member of the Comhaltas National Folk Orchestra of Ireland.

We know that she and her family are at the heart of her local community. She was a much-loved school teacher and had so much to offer in so many ways. Her school principal is James Hogan, another Comhaltas stalwart.

The brutal manner of her death – in the middle of the day – as she jogged by the banks of the peaceful canal in Tullamore has left us numbed and bewildered. The suffering of her family at the loss of

such a young and beautiful person is beyond understanding. We share their grief with them and we will always remember Ashling as one who enriched our lives with her warm personality; uplifting musicmaking; compassionate, outgoing and generous friendship.

Ashling, you will always be in our thoughts and prayers as we cherish the memories and friendship of your short but exceptional life. Ar dheis Dé go raibh do anam uasal ceolmhar.

To perpetuate Ashling's memory, Comhaltas is planning CEILIÚRADH ASHLING; a Scholarship Scheme and a renactment of MACALLA NA hÉIREANN, the Irish Concert Tour of which Ashling was a much valued member.

FLEADHANNA

There is an obvious spring in the steps of Comhaltas County Boards and Provincial Councils since the Government's announcement of lifting restrictions in relation to the pandemic. This will have a huge positive impact in the making of arrangements for the Fleadhanna this year. This is ATHNUACHAN (Renewal) in action.
